Then on January 31, we completed our transfer of sponsorship of Divine Savior Healthcare (DSH) in Portage, Wis. With approval at the highest level of the Catholic Church, DSH is now officially part of the Aspirus health system based in Wausau, Wis. This transfer marks the end of an era for us, and I can assure you, it didn't just happen.

Over many months, Sisters of the Divine Savior, DSH and Aspirus performed our due diligence to make sure it was the right thing to do for all of us. It's exciting for DSH to become part of a thriving system with a strong commitment to community-based health care. A s planning evolved for our 2020 Passion for Mission celebration, it stirred up memories of people who became living, breathing "milestones" throughout our 125-year history in the U.S. Many such milestones are Salvatorian Sisters who came before us, on whose shoulders we stand today. Others are supportive families, generous friends and faithful donors who continue to inspire us to bring the love of our Savior to those we serve in His name.

She also shared about another far-reaching impact, the joyous news that five Pakistani women professed vows with the local Salvatorian community.

## Companions in Mission

It's been 20 years since Therese D. of Bayside, Wis. got an up-close viewpoint on the Sisters of the Divine Savior sponsorship ministry. Therese, who goes by Tracy, served seven years on the Board of Directors for the former St. Mary's Nursing Home in Milwaukee. She recalls, "I was most impressed by the honest caring always shown by the sisters. As the nursing home struggled to survive, the sisters faced difficult decisions, yet never wavered in their commitment to serving the residents, even when weighed against their other priorities."

Tracy came to St. Mary's board in 1993 on recommendation by an outgoing board member, someone she considered a mentor. Her expertise was a strong fit with the board's needs. Professionally, Tracy's responsibilities included oversight of services to transition acute care patients — often to a skilled care facility or nursing home — so she understood patient needs and administrative challenges.

Tracy also has fond memories of St. Mary's board annual holiday gatherings, saying, "They were a great opportunity to get to know other board members and the sisters more personally. Their goodness and warmth held true outside the board room — the sisters were the 'real deal'!"





As the 2019 Advent season began, we asked you to open your hearts to support the needs of our North American Province. In our 2019 Christmas letter, you read about Sister Darlene Pienschke's ministry to provide humanitarian aid to refugees at the U.S./Mexico border. Her work there is just one example of how we adapt our ministries to changing needs. In response to that letter, you blessed us with 412 gifts ranging from \$1 to \$20,000. Each and every gift, no matter the size, kindles our mission spirit. Your trust in us and your generosity are powerful sparks.

#### Your gifts touch lives near and far



We depend on your generosity, but we want you to know we continue our efforts to procure monetary grants from foundations too. Last year we received grants to fund special initiatives, including: prospecting for new members; developing a new SDS website; and implementing the Pastoral Agents Program in Colombia, South America to prepare lay leaders to carry on our sisters' apostolic works.

Also in 2019, we affirmed support for Salvatorian ministries in developing countries by renewing our commitment to the diocesan mission co-op program. Last summer 13 sisters traveled to 17 parishes in 8 dioceses across the U.S. to talk about our worldwide missions. Among them was Sister Magda Kumorek visiting from our Polish Province. During our mission talks, we share experiences of our international sisters who serve in their home lands to improve quality of life through education, job training, medical care, housing projects, elder care, anti-trafficking efforts and social work. It's humbling to witness selfless giving by members of large and small parish communities. Most have never before met a Salvatorian Sister, but like you, they reach deep into their hearts to share their blessings with God's neediest people.
